Dear Convener,

I write to inform you of the outcome of a recent review of the statutory guidance for Scotland's Redress Scheme ("the Scheme").

A suite of statutory guidance was published and laid before Parliament when the Scheme was launched. The Scottish Government committed to review the guidance as the Scheme progressed and to update the guidance as appropriate. As the Scheme has now been open and operational for over two years, it was deemed an appropriate time to conduct this review.

Six pieces of guidance were identified as requiring updates in the first instance. Working collaboratively with Redress Scotland the review sought to improve readability, remove areas of ambiguity and address discrete operational matters. Feedback from survivors and stakeholders has also informed improvements to the guidance.
