Scottish Welfare Fund

At a time when people are facing significant increases to their cost of living, the Committee is aware that the Scottish Welfare Fund (SWF) can play an important role in supporting households' incomes. The Committee understands delivery of the 22 actions contained within the [Scottish Welfare Fund: action plan](#) were due to be completed by the end of Summer 2024.

Work carried out by the Committee has underscored the importance of the SWF and Crisis Grants in particular. Testimony heard during the Committee's inquiry into parental employment emphasised the financial concerns of families, and research the Committee commissioned on the [extra costs of living with a disability](#) indicated disabled households are more vulnerable to rising energy and food prices.

The Committee's work around homelessness has also persuaded Members that the SWF is an important aspect of social security in Scotland, given the ability of the Community Care Grant in helping people work towards more stable accommodation.

Given these aspects, the Committee requests an update on whether the specific actions being taken are having the intended impact. The Committee is especially interested in the following action points:

- *Action 5:* Provide clearer definitions on eligibility and what constitutes 'exceptional circumstances'.
- *Action 14:* Restructure to improve accessibility and ease of use.
- *Action 15:* Review income thresholds for applicant eligibility.

If delivery has not yet concluded the Committee seeks an update on the progress made so far and an expected completion date.

A response by 9 December 2024 would be appreciated to inform consideration of the Committee's future work programme.
