- Meeting to discuss the cost-of-living crisis and survey conducted of the CPG members on what support would be helpful from Scottish Government including the promotion of the sector to help raise awareness and potential for funding opportunities.
- A Scottish Government official presented on Community Wealth Building and discussed how credit unions are key to the financial pillar.

#### Meeting 17th January 2024:

- 17 total attendees. 3 MSP's in attendance and 14 attendees from the credit union sector (of which 6 were from credit union trade associations and 8 were invited guests from the credit unions).
- CPG held AGM and annual election of office bearers. Remaining agenda focused on the priorities for the CPG in 2024, the expectations of the CPG and office bearers including secretariat. There was then a presentation on Artificial Intelligence in the financial sector to discuss the risk and opportunities available to the sector.

In previous Parliamentary terms, the CPG has organised a reception in Parliament to mark International Credit Union Day, with financial support from CUNA Mutual for catering to the value of £2000. No arrangements are in place at this time to

hold a similar event over the next 12 months, but it is possible that the CPG may have a similar event at some point over the course of this Parliament.
