<u>S6M-13487</u> Marie McNair: Action Mesothelioma Day 2024—That the Parliament recognises Action Mesothelioma Day 2024, which is on 5 July 2024; understands that mesothelioma is a rare cancer that is usually caused by exposure to asbestos, with tiny fibres getting into the lungs and damaging them over time; notes that the cancer most commonly occurs in the lining of the lung, but can also occur in the lining of the abdomen and the lining of the heart, with symptoms including shortness of breath, chest pain, coughing and tiredness; understands that there are around 2,700 new mesothelioma cases in the UK every year, including around 200 in Scotland;

recognises that Action Mesothelioma Day is a national event to raise awareness of asbestos and mesothelioma, raise vital funds to support the research into tackling mesothelioma, and to remember and support those who have been affected by the disease; notes with interest that a £2.1 million Cancer Research UK grant has been awarded to the University of Glasgow with the aim of answering the question of why it can take decades for exposure to the fibrous mineral to develop into cancer; applauds the long-standing and ongoing work of the Clydebank Asbestos Group, which has provided information and support to people with asbestos-related conditions for over 30 years; notes the calls for continued research into mesothelioma, and hopes for a successful Action Mesothelioma Day 2024.

S6M-13640 Beatrice Wishart: Rural and Island Digital Connectivity Challenges—That the Parliament notes with concern that many households in rural and island Scotland face challenges regarding digital connectivity; understands that Ofcom reports that 25% of Shetland households have broadband speeds of less than 30Mbps; further understands that, despite the initial Scottish Government ambition to connect every household to superfast broadband by 2021 through the R100 programme, it is now estimated that full R100 rollout will not be achieved until 2028; notes the reported intention of telecommunications companies to retire the copper phone line network and replace phone lines with digital connections using fibre broadband; understands that this replacement is due by 2027; notes with concern reports that many households are unable to switch to digital phone lines due to lack of broadband connectivity in their area, which, it understands, can cause particular problems for customers with healthcare devices that use the phone line, or those who live in areas with poor mobile phone signal; expresses its disappointment that rural and island households are facing such difficulties, particularly in light of increasingly frequent adverse weather events, which, it understands, put rural and island households at risk of power outages; considers that poor 4G signal in rural and island areas has negative implications for businesses and education: understands that many households in Scotland are unable to be connected to smart meters due to poor connectivity of the smart meter network in their areas, with latest figures showing that less than 10% of households in Scotland's island groups have smart meters; further understands that many of these households still use legacy radio teleswitch meters, with Scotland having a higher proportion of these meters than other parts of the UK; notes with concern that the radio teleswitch signal is due to be switched off by 30 June 2025, which, it believes, could leave households stuck paying higher tariffs; further notes the belief that a digital divide is detrimental, and notes the calls for both of Scotland's governments to work together to address the digital connectivity challenges facing households in rural and island Scotland.

Clackmannanshire military veterans, who described themselves as "honoured" to have attended the 80th D-Day anniversary commemorations in Portsmouth during the 80th anniversary in June 2024; understands that the four former members of the armed forces, three representing Clackmannanshire and one from Falkirk, are believed to have been the only veterans attending from the region as the UK marked eight decades since the start of the combined naval, air and land assault on Nazi-occupied France; acknowledges that possibly the most famous military operation of all time and the largest seaborne invasion in history, the Normandy landings took place on 6 June 1944; considers that, on 5 June 2024, which was the date in 1944 that many troops set off from Portsmouth, a commemoration took place at Southsea Common with high-

profile guests including His Majesty The King, D-Day veterans and guests, including Clacks Royal Navy veterans Andy Roxburgh and Bernard Severin, as well as army veterans Murdoch McGregor and Billy McWilliams from Falkirk; understands that this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for the exservices personnel, three of whom are members of support group Wee County Veterans, was a chance to hear first-hand from the still surviving few who were on the beaches eight decades ago; concurs with Andy, as chair of the group, who was quoted in local press that "It was quite an honour to, first, be selected to attend and secondly to represent the Wee County, Wee County Veterans and all the ex-service personnel who live in this area"; welcomes the group's attendance; sends its gratitude to the group and all the veterans for their service, and commends SSAFA, the Armed Forces charity, for its organisation of what it considers to be this excellent opportunity for the group.

*S6M-13799 Kenneth Gibson: Commemorating the 200th Birthday of William Thomson, Later Lord Kelvin—That the Parliament joins the University of Glasgow in commemorating the 200th anniversary of William Thomson's birth on 26 June 1824; recognises him as a distinguished physicist, mathematician and engineer who later became 1st Baron Kelvin of Largs, due to his time spent in his property in Netherhall, which he built in the 1870s and where he died in 1907; acknowledges what it sees as the world-changing legacy of Lord Kelvin, including the central role he played in laying the first transatlantic telegraph cables, advancing an understanding of thermodynamics and inventing the mariner's compass, amongst many innovations; honours his role as a dedicated educator and his long-standing tenure as a Professor at the University of Glasgow, where he inspired and mentored countless students and future scientists; notes that he was just 10 years old upon matriculating to the University of Glasgow, and was the first scientist ever to be appointment to the House of Lords; celebrates the lasting impact of his work, which, it believes, continues to inspire and inform contemporary STEM research and innovation, and encourages MSPs to engage with the University's exhibitions, talks and events that will take place throughout 2024 exploring his legacy and impact.

*S6M-13798 Willie Rennie: Homes for Scotland Home Builders 2024 Report—That the

Parliament notes the findings and recommendations of the recently published, *Homes for Scotland SME Home Builders 2024: Data Review and Industry Insights* report; welcomes the data review conducted by Rettie & Co, which examines what it sees as the SME home builders vital role in Scotland's housing eco-system and the extensive insights gathered from SMEs on the reported challenges that they face delivering homes across all tenures in Scotland; notes that, according to the report, five of the SMEs who reported their insights consider Fife as their key market for housing delivery; further notes that the report also highlights SME insights that planning, government regulation, interest rates and relationships with water supply and sewage and wastewater providers as presenting barriers to activity; understands that SMEs are now delivering a lower proportion of new housing, now accounting for 20% of new home sales, and that until 2017 it was typically 40%; considers that as well as driving rural and remote home building, SMEs are also key to unlocking technically difficult brownfield sites, which, it understands, the Scottish Government wants to prioritise, and believes that the research fills a significant data gap, which is essential for developing evidence-based policy to effectively address the housing emergency.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
