**\*[S6M-13820](#) Sandesh Gulhane: Riverside Dalmarnock Honoured at Industry Housing Awards**—That the Parliament congratulates the Riverside Dalmarnock development upon winning Age Exclusive Development of the Year at the Scottish Home Awards 2024; notes that the award, given for Phase 3 of the development, is the most recent recognition for Riverside Dalmarnock, which has previously won the Architecture: Regeneration award at the Scottish Design Awards 2022, Affordable Housing Development of the Year and Housing Regeneration Project of the Year at the Homes for Scotland Awards 2022; understands that the development is a partnership project between Link Group and McTaggart Construction; recognises that Riverside Dalmarnock is a mixed tenure development of 562 new homes, providing a mixture of homes for affordable rent, new supply shared equity, mid-market rent and private purchase, and welcomes the regeneration of the Dalmarnock area in Glasgow, involving an array of projects to create new homes, community venues, amenities and green spaces, revitalising the area for the future.

**\*[S6M-13819](#) Alexander Burnett: Gerald Loble, from Kemnay, Appointed MBE for his Services to Chess in Scotland**—That the Parliament congratulates Gerald Loble, from Kemnay, on being appointed an MBE in The King's Birthday Honours for his services to chess in Scotland; notes that Gerald has volunteered for half a century to organise competitions and coaching sessions for people of all ages in north east Scotland, instructing future generations on how to play the traditional board game; further notes that he has been able to help many young people in north east Scotland to access coaching and competitions, irrespective of their socioeconomic background, by offering free entry to clubs and contests through his involvement in the management of the North East Junior Chess Association; notes that he recently helped refugees from Ukraine play the game under his tutelage, and wishes Gerald all the best for the future.

**\*[S6M-13818](#) Christine Grahame: Crisis in Gaza**—That the Parliament notes with concern the ongoing crisis in Gaza, where, according to Oxfam, at least 37,658 Palestinians have been killed since October 2023, in addition to 86,237 people injured, and more than 10,000 people missing, presumably under rubble and awaiting recovery; understands that, of those missing, Save the Children has said that thousands of them are believed to be children, and has stated that "it is nearly impossible to collect and verify information under the current conditions in Gaza but at least

17,000 children are believed to be unaccompanied and separated and approximately 4,000 children are likely missing under the rubble, with an unknown number also in mass graves"; further understands that, in addition, at least 1,512 Israelis and foreign nationals, including 312 soldiers, have been killed in Israel, the vast majority on 7 October 2023, with an estimated 120 Israelis and foreign nationals remaining captive in Gaza, including fatalities whose bodies are being withheld; considers that the eight months of relentless violence in Gaza has led to a grave humanitarian situation, with figures released by the Integrated Food Security Phase Classification showing that 96% of the population of Gaza is facing acute food shortages, and more than 495,000 people, including children, are facing starvation due to an extreme lack of food, in addition to risks of epidemic, injury and disease; further considers that this situation represents a human tragedy of unimaginable scale, and calls on the international community, including the UK Government, to do more to de-escalate the conflict and to urgently assist with the humanitarian crisis facing the people of Gaza.

The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
