\*<u>S6M-14748</u> Christine Grahame: Commending Borders Vets Fundraising to Tackle Suicide in the Profession—That the Parliament recognises the fundraising efforts of four vets, three of whom are based in the Borders branches of Galedin Vets, to benefit the charities Vetlife and the Canmore Trust, which provide support and a community for those impacted by suicide in the industry; notes that Maria Mylne, Mary Hall, Callum McRoberts and Chris Burn are currently undertaking a 1,189-mile cycle from Land's End to John O'Groats in memory of their friend and colleague, Kirsty, also Chris's partner, who took her own life, with them having set off on 23 September 2024 and due to finish on 18 October; understands that Kirsty was a dedicated vet who, amongst many other achievements, was the first and only winner of consecutive employee of the month awards at her place of work; notes that Vetlife has said that vets in the UK are three to four times more likely to die by suicide than the general population, making this profession a particularly at-risk group; commends those involved for their efforts; supports the message that suicide is not inevitable, and shares the desire to break the cycle of suicide and keep building suicide safer communities.

### \*<u>S6M-14747</u> Claire Baker: Dunblane Boys' Brigade Member Jamie Oldham Completes

Sporting Marathon Challenge for Malawi Fundraiser—That the Parliament commends Dunblane Boys' Brigade member, Jamie Oldham, on completing the triple sporting challenge fundraising event at Dunblane Sports Hub as part of the Boys' Brigade club's efforts to support the Malawian village of Likhubula in the East African nation; understands that Jamie recently took on the challenge of completing a near-triple marathon distance of 75 miles in a single day while taking part in three different sports, alternating between rowing machine, exercise bike and tennis courts; notes that the sponsored event was part of the local Boys' Brigade Malawi 2025 group, which will see a group travel to the village of Likhubula, with whom Dunblane has had a near two-decadelong relationship, with small-scale, sustainable projects funded with the aim of improving the lives of those living there; acknowledges that the Boys' Brigade club is hoping to raise £21,000 in total from individual sponsorship efforts to ensure that everyone who was selected for the trip team can travel regardless of their means to pay for such an expensive journey; believes that, for the full month of October, 25 Junior Section in Dunblane will take on cycling challenges to raise funds for fertiliser and food aid in Likhubula; commends everyone for their efforts and thanks all those who have kindly supported the group with donations; extends its very best wishes for the success of the fundraising effort and the upcoming coffee morning and the soup and sweet lunch in Dunblane Cathedral Hall, and hopes that everyone enjoys the planned trip to Malawi in 2025.

\*<u>S6M-14745</u> Foysol Choudhury: Recognising the Work of Resuscitation Council UK—That the Parliament recognises what it sees as the important work of Resuscitation Council UK (RCUK); understands that RCUK is the national expert for resuscitation in the UK and works to improve survival rates for in- and out-of-hospital cardiac arrest through education, training and research; notes with concern RCUK reporting that 3,000 people in Scotland have a cardiac arrest every year yet do not have the same rehabilitation services and support as other medical issues such as strokes; welcomes the publication of the RCUK My Right to Cardiac Arrest Recovery quality standard, which outlines key measures to ensure that survivors of cardiac arrest receive access to essential care, enhanced service and better health outcomes; acknowledges the RCUK

policy report, *Every Second Counts: Tackling Inequalities in Resuscitation*, which revealed inequalities in resuscitation across the UK, with ethnicity and socio-economic status affecting a persons' chance of surviving a cardiac arrest due to lack of CPR training or access to defibrillators, and believes that as much as possible should be done to ensure that those who have had a cardiac arrest can access appropriate ongoing care, and defibrillators are publicly accessible in case of cardiac arrest.

\*<u>S6M-14744</u> Monica Lennon: Congratulating Supporting Our Community in Hamilton on its Award of £15,000 from the ASDA Foundation's Spaces and Places Grant Fund—That the Parliament congratulates Supporting Our Community (SCIO) in Hamilton on its award of £15,000 from the Asda Foundation's Spaces and Places grant fund; understands that this funding will enable the transformation of a vacant space into a community garden and growing initiative with summer house, paths and raised beds; further understands that this community garden will provide excellent gardening volunteering opportunities for the people of Hamilton; applauds Supporting Our Community's commitment and its ongoing dedication to providing year-round support and welcoming and inclusive services where people can come together; notes what it sees as the importance of community gardens in improving the mental health of both locals and volunteers, and welcomes the positive impact that they have on improving local biodiversity.

\*S6M-14743 Annie Wells: TRNSMT Festival Awarded Highest Accessibility Honour—That the Parliament congratulates DF Concerts and the Rockstar Energy presents TRNSMT Festival on being awarded the prestigious Platinum status from Attitude is Everything, a pioneering charity that supports the music industry to be more accessible to disabled people; understands that the award makes the dedicated music festival the first ever to hold such recognition; notes the festival's ongoing commitment to creating an inclusive and accessible environment for all music fans; further notes that Platinum status is the highest accolade awarded by Attitude is Everything, and that the award demonstrates the industry-leading commitment to accessibility, highlighting the festival's comprehensive measures to ensure that all attendees can enjoy a safe and barrier-free experience; recognises that, in 2024, the DF Concerts Accessibility Team worked to create an inclusive space for everyone, including increasing the capacity of the main stage accessible viewing platform by almost 51% and the introduction of a ground-level viewing area, which meant that the total main stage accessible area increased by 74% from 2023, and understands that the festival has introduced or improved several initiatives to enhance accessibility, including the development of a sensory tent and sensory kits for neurodivergent fans, the installation of accessible picnic benches throughout the site, increased accessibility training for staff and volunteers, the continuation of lowered counters and accessible lanes at the bars, the introduction of a volunteer running service, and the integration of the Nimbus Access Card for the 2025 festival.
