### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

**\*[S6M-14683](#) Paul O'Kane: Challenge Poverty Week 2024**—That the Parliament recognises Challenge Poverty Week 2024, which is coordinated by the Poverty Alliance, Scotland's anti-poverty network, and runs from 7 to 13 October; notes that activities, events and actions will take place across Scotland, including in the West Scotland region, which will be aimed at increasing public support for tackling poverty and highlighting the realities of, and solutions to, poverty; acknowledges that Challenge Poverty Week 2023 was the biggest yet, with over 500 organisations taking part; notes that the week emphasises the need for fair funding for the third sector and the importance of a number of key policy asks, including across housing, transport, adequate incomes and food, to help unlock people from the grip of poverty; understands that 21% of people, and 24% of children, are living in the grip of poverty; notes the view that governments, elected members, civil society and communities all have a role to play in solving poverty; is concerned that particular groups of people, including women, lone parents, disabled people and people from black and minority ethnic backgrounds, are disproportionately experiencing poverty; considers that people in Scotland believe in compassion, justice and ending poverty; celebrates the work undertaken by organisations and communities across Scotland to stem what it sees as the rising tide of poverty, and notes the calls for MSPs to attend and support events and activities in their constituencies and regions as part of what it believes is this important campaign.

**\*[S6M-14690](#) John Mason: International Day of Awareness of Food Loss and Waste**

**Reduction**—That the Parliament recognises the five-year anniversary of the International Day of Awareness of Food Loss and Waste Reduction on 29 September 2024; understands that this international day was founded by the United Nations to highlight the need to bolster efforts to reduce food loss and waste, contribute to achieving climate goals and advance the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development Goals; acknowledges that, globally, around 13.2% of food produced is lost between harvest and retail, while an estimated 19% of total global food production is wasted in households, in the food service and in retail all together; understands that investments that reduce food loss and waste contribute to improving food security, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, enable healthy diets, and contribute to ensuring a future where food availability is not threatened by climate, and encourages everyone to continue to raise awareness of food loss and waste reduction in an attempt to achieve sustainability goals.

**\*[S6M-14688](#) Monica Lennon: Congratulations to Christie the Baker on Winning the South Scotland Category at the National Bakery Awards 2024**

—That the Parliament congratulates much-loved Christie the Baker on winning the South Scotland Category at the National Bakery Awards 2024; recognises that Christie the Baker has been serving the communities of Coatbridge, Airdrie and Whitburn for over 80 years, providing high-quality baked goods, pies and pastries; considers that this recognition is a testament to the skill, creativity and dedication of the 70-strong team, and acknowledges what it sees as the important role that Christie the Baker plays in supporting the local community and its regular contributions to charitable causes.

**Being the Highest in Europe**—That the Parliament notes the publication of UEFA's annual report, *The European Club Talent and Competition Landscape*; acknowledges that the Scottish Professional Football League (SPFL) William Hill Premiership recorded the highest top-flight football attendances per capita in Europe for the 2023-24 season, with 18.36 regular attendees per 1,000 people; recognises that this figure is nearly 80% higher than the second-placed Primeira Liga in Portugal; notes that the near 3.8 million fans cumulatively attending top-flight matches in Scotland last season was the eighth highest in Europe, with an average league attendance of 16,500, which is the seventh highest in Europe; congratulates Celtic FC and Rangers FC on joining an elite list of clubs with over one million home supporters across the season; commends the passion and dedication of Scottish football supporters across the entire Scottish football league system and at junior and amateur level, and urges all stakeholders to continue supporting and growing the national game by prioritising the interests of supporters, who, it believes, must always be at the heart of Scottish football.

The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
