***[S6M-00535](#) Jim Fairlie: Picture of a Pandemic**—That the Parliament welcomes the publication by the PKAVS Minority Communities Hub of the report, *Picture of a Pandemic*, which is the result of several months of extensive community engagement that aims to paint a picture of the experiences of the COVID-19 pandemic of BAME people in Perth and Kinross; believes that the Communities Hub is the lead organisation in supporting the expanding migrant population in Perth and Kinross; notes that it offers tailored support to people from minority backgrounds, particularly Eastern European, South Asian and Chinese people; considers that, while the experience of BAME people in the area are not homogeneous, there are important lessons to be derived from the findings of this report, and encourages all decision makers to consider its findings carefully.

***[S6M-00534](#) Jackson Carlaw: Congratulations to Giffnock Tennis Club, LTA Club of the Year 2021**—That the Parliament congratulates Giffnock Tennis Club for winning The Lawn Tennis Association's (LTA) flagship Club of Year award for 2021; understands that the club received the commendation for its outstanding work in growing the sport across Eastwood and the Glasgow region, for its fantastic efforts to enhance participation in tennis, and for the way the club has adapted to the COVID-19 pandemic; acknowledges that over the course of the pandemic, the club was still able to make the sport welcoming and accessible when activity has been able to proceed in the past 16 months, and fostered a morale boosting and inclusive environment for club members; notes that at the outset of the pandemic, the club established the Giffnock Community Outreach Project in order to make sure that all members, their families and friends would not be left to face any difficulties caused by the pandemic alone and provided a range of vital supports including food parcels, care packages, a telephone buddy system and online social events; recognises that it was the first sports club across Scotland to become COVID-19 compliant with an overhaul of its coaching set up, reconfiguration of facilities, communications network and clubhouse allowing the organisation to achieve its largest ever membership despite the challenges brought on by the pandemic; further recognises that the club has also established a new app and has been at the forefront of leading a welcoming tennis community in Scotland, with participation in the sport at the Percy Drive facility rising by 33%; notes that the club was announced as winners of the award by the Chief Executive of the All England Tennis Club, Sally Bolton OBE, and

presented with the prize by the LTA Head of Men's Tennis and Great Britain's Davis Cup captain, Leon Smith OBE, at a live streamed event on Thursday 24 June 2021; notes that the 2021 online ceremony is the sixth year of the LTA Tennis Awards and the purpose of the event is to celebrate the accomplishments of outstanding tennis coaches, volunteers, players, venues and officials throughout the country and that nominations for the eventual 16 national winners were identified from almost 5,000 coaches, 25,000 volunteers, 1,000 officials, 22,000 schools, nearly 3,000 clubs and over 9,000 LTA approved tournaments; again congratulates Giffnock Tennis Club on being named LTA Club of the Year, and praises the club for all of its excellent work during the pandemic. ***S6M-00533 Paul McLennan: Congratulating North Berwick Under 13s**—That the Parliament congratulates the North Berwick Under 13s football team on their victory in the South East Region Youth Football League Cup Final on 24 June 2021; notes that the team represented North Berwick and East Lothian incredibly well, and wishes them all the best in their sporting futures.

***S6M-00531 Kaukab Stewart: Partick Thistle Football Club's Welcome Return to Scottish Championship**—That the Parliament congratulates Partick Thistle FC on its welcome return to the Scottish Championship after being crowned champions of League One; notes that its league triumph was achieved in some style with a 5-0 win over Falkirk on 29 April 2021; commends the hard work of the manager, Ian McCall, and the dedication of all the club's players, coaches and staff in securing this well-deserved promotion; recognises the economic, social and cultural contribution that the club has made, and continues to make, across the Glasgow Kelvin constituency, particularly in providing a family-friendly atmosphere at its games and, through the significant work of the Partick Thistle Charitable Trust, delivering tens of thousands of free meals to some of the most vulnerable members of the local community during the COVID-19 pandemic; notes that Thistle will kick off its league season on 17 October 2021 away against Clyde FC at Broadwood Stadium, with its first home fixture at Firhill being played the following weekend against Airdrie FC, and wishes Thistle every success in the coming season in the Scottish Championship.

***S6M-00530 Douglas Lumsden: Accounts Commission Best Value Assurance Report, Aberdeen City Council**—That the Parliament congratulates the 2020 UK Council of the Year, Aberdeen City Council, following the Accounts Commission's *Best Value Assurance Report*, which stated that the local authority had significantly improved its performance over the last five years; understands that the Accounts Commission commended the council on performance gains made since its last assessment in 2015, attributing this to a "major transformation programme", which allowed the council's strategies to be firmly aligned with the Local Outcome Improvement Plan, with an emphasis on welfare and wellbeing; highlights that the council responded well to the multiple impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, and recognises that the Accounts Commission acknowledged the comprehensive scale of the council's capital programme, which in recent years has delivered a £330 million event complex, an award-winning development of Aberdeen Art Gallery, the city's biggest council house building programme in a generation, and infrastructure to tackle climate change. **R**

***S6M-00529 Clare Adamson: Braidhurst High School, Supporting the Community**—That the Parliament commends the staff, pupils and families at Braidhurst High School in Motherwell for their donations to the school's foodbank over the last year; understands that recent donations have resulted in a further 56 food parcels being delivered to families in the area; recognises the schools ongoing commitment to the community, and wishes everyone at the school well for the future.

***[S6M-00528](#) Clare Adamson: Two Prestigious Awards for New College Lanarkshire**—That the Parliament congratulates New College Lanarkshire on its success at *The Herald* Higher Education Awards 2021, winning the Outstanding Business Engagement in Colleges category for its Lanarkshire Business Hub and the Innovative Use of Technology award for its Virtual Autodesk Digital Construction Challenge; understands that, for over 10 years, the Business Hub has provided a forum for the business community, bringing together key partners, industry experts and businesses for monthly events and workshops and that, since the COVID-19 lockdown, it has successfully transitioned to an online forum, enabling members to learn, network and collaborate for the benefit of the area's economy; notes that it has 500 members, representing businesses ranging from large multinationals to sole traders, across 62 different sectors; understands that the Virtual Autodesk Digital Construction Challenge was led by lecturer, Michael McGuire, who is the WorldSkills UK training manager for Building Information Modelling (BIM), and Philipp Mueller at Autodesk, who devised and delivered a virtual version of a UK-wide BIM competition in the months following the lockdown to ensure that students would not miss out on the chance to compete against their peers; recognises the hard work and dedication by all involved in both initiatives, and wishes them, and all at New College Lanarkshire, well in all their current and future endeavours.

***[S6M-00527](#) Gillian Mackay: Larbert High School, the First Gold Level SCQF School Ambassador**—That the Parliament notes that Larbert High School has been confirmed as the first Gold Level Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) School Ambassador; acknowledges that the School Ambassador programme offers secondary schools the opportunity to learn more about what it sees as the benefits of the SCQF and the wider ways that it supports learners, such as recognising wider achievement, developing senior phase learning pathways and demonstrating equality between vocational and academic qualifications; understands that the SCQF Partnership launched the tiered recognition element of the School Ambassador programme in August 2020 to make sure that all the work on enhancing learning pathways that is being carried out in secondary schools across the country is recognised, highlighted and celebrated; acknowledges that Larbert High School has received a gold plaque which will be displayed in the school's reception area, and congratulates the school's staff and pupils on this achievement.

***[S6M-00484](#) Gordon MacDonald: Stamp Out Scams Campaign**—That the Parliament commends Royal Mail on the launch of its new online campaign, "Stamp Out Scams"; notes that the campaign intends to help keep Royal Mail customers safe from scammers who seek to commit crime using the Royal Mail brand; further notes that arrests have recently been made in connection with alleged scams; believes that Royal Mail has been collaborating with a number of law enforcement agencies, which led to these arrests; understands that some 30,000 websites linked with fraudulent activity have been taken down; recognises that the "Stamp Out Scams" campaign provides Royal Mail customers with valuable information on how to spot scams, as well as tips on how to report them, and on how customers can differentiate between real and fake
