*S6M-00992 Monica Lennon: Congratulations to Sharon Graham - New General Secretary of Unite the Union—That the Parliament congratulates Sharon Graham on being elected as the new General Secretary of Unite the Union; notes that she is the first woman to be elected to this position; understands that she has a strong track record of organising and building power in the workplace as a trade union organiser, campaigner and strategist; further understands that Unite has 1.2 million members across the UK, and that Sharon's appointment comes at a time when working people urgently need trade unions to fight hard for better pay, jobs and conditions, and wishes Sharon Graham all the best in her new role, including the campaign she is leading against Amazon for union recognition for its workers. 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*S6M-00985 Carol Mochan: A Helping Hand for South Scotland—That the Parliament considers the UK's social security system to be cruel and hostile towards working people; believes that the current UK administration has failed to deliver a social security system that protects those in greatest need; recognises what it sees as the particular cumulative impact that such policies have had on communities across south Scotland, which it considers have borne the brunt of deindustrialisation over recent decades; understands that such impacts include between a 5% to 10% increase in the number of people who are dependent on universal credit in South and East Ayrshire, between May 2020 and May 2021; acknowledges what it sees as the detrimental effect that further cuts would have on a broad range of households in the South Scotland region, in particular those with young children, and believes that the Scottish Government has considerable underused powers over social security that are being neglected and which, if utilised, could alleviate this problem, including increasing the Scottish Child Payment to £20 per week, which it considers should be introduced as a matter of urgency.

*S6M-00949 Sharon Dowey: Troon Volunteer Raises £1,145 for Ayrshire Cancer Support—
That the Parliament commends Bob Faulks, of Troon, who has completed a cycle challenge from Troon to the Beatson West of Scotland Cancer Centre in Glasgow's West End; understands that Bob made the trip every day since 1 January 2021, totalling 5,250 miles in 232 days, which is a longer distance than if he were to go from Troon to Los Angeles; further understands that Bob wanted to raise funds ahead of Ayrshire Cancer Support's September A to B Challenge, which encourages cyclists to travel from locations in Ayrshire to the Beatson Centre and back; notes that Bob was successful in raising £1,145 for the charity; recognises the incredible work done by Ayrshire Cancer Support, whose drivers make about 12,000 journeys to the Beatson from Ayrshire every year to ensure cancer patients can access treatment there, and praises Bob on his charitable efforts.
