**S6M-02911 Ruth Maguire: Online Pimping**—That the Parliament commends the Cross-Party Group on Commercial Sexual Exploitation for its inquiry into pimping websites and its report, *Online Pimping: An Inquiry into Sexual Exploitation Advertising Websites*; understands that pimping websites, which profit from advertising individuals for prostitution, operate with impunity in Scotland, including in the Cunninghame South constituency; considers that pimping websites facilitate demand for prostitution by enabling men who pay for sex to quickly and anonymously locate women to sexually exploit; believes that pimping websites facilitate and incentivise sex trafficking by centralising and concentrating demand online and making it quick and easy to advertise victims; understands that the Scottish Government recognises prostitution as a form of violence against women; notes what it sees as the Scottish Government's commitment to develop a model for Scotland to challenge men's demand for prostitution, and notes the view that the new model for Scotland must outlaw online pimping in order to deter demand and prevent sex trafficking.

**\*[S6M-03166](#) Graham Simpson: Workplace Parking Licensing (Scotland) Regulations 2022 (SSI 2022/4)**—That the Net Zero, Energy and Transport Committee recommends that the Workplace Parking Licensing (Scotland) Regulations 2022 (SSI 2022/4) be annulled.

**\*[S6M-03104](#) Michelle Thomson: New Addiction Clinic for Grangemouth**—That the Parliament welcomes steps taken by volunteers at Kersiebank Community Project (KCP) to establish an addiction drop-in clinic in Grangemouth; understands that the clinic will run on Thursdays from 9.30 am to 1.00 pm at the KCP building in Grangemouth town centre, with representatives from Change Grow Live and Forth Valley Family Support services and from Scottish Families Affected by Alcohol and Drugs providing advice; notes what it sees as the significant impact that addiction has on the lives of people and families across communities; considers that it is important to reduce the stigma attached to addiction to enable individuals to seek the support they need to help them recover fully; commends the Scottish Government's national mission to reduce drug related deaths and harms; further commends what it sees as the Scottish Government's commitment to tackle Scotland's complex and harmful relationship with alcohol through minimum unit pricing and the national Alcohol Framework; calls on the UK Government to work with the Scottish Government to find a better way to address substance misuse in communities; commends the work of the volunteers involved with the KCP, and looks forward to this new addiction clinic helping to change lives in and around the communities of Grangemouth.

**\*[S6M-03103](#) Jackie Baillie: RCN Scotland Employment Survey** —That the Parliament notes with concern, the findings of the Royal College of Nursing (RCN) Scotland employment survey; notes that the survey found that 61% of nursing staff in Scotland were thinking about leaving their jobs, with 20% actively planning to leave; further notes that, according to the survey, 40% of respondents were working beyond their contractual hours, 67% were too busy to deliver the standard of care that they would like and 78% felt that they were under too much pressure at work; understands that there is a record high number of 5,761 nursing and midwifery vacancies in NHS Scotland; believes that nursing staff have worked tirelessly throughout the pandemic in extremely

difficult circumstances to keep the most vulnerable in society protected; considers that nursing staff are an undervalued workforce, and believes that the Scottish Government must use its power to give nurses a proper pay rise, without which, it considers, the staffing crisis within nursing will only worsen.

**\*[S6M-03102](#) Douglas Lumsden: In Memory of Professor Sir Charles Duncan Rice**—That the Parliament notes with great sadness the passing of Professor Sir Charles Duncan Rice, Principle of the University of Aberdeen from 1996 to 2010; recognises what it sees as his impressive academic career at the University of Aberdeen, the University of Edinburgh, the University of New York and the University of Yale; further recognises his time, as an Aberdonian, leading his home University where, it believes, he significantly advanced both its outlook and international standing; understands that he spearheaded a philanthropic fundraising campaign on a scale not previously seen in Scotland, the flagship of which was the £57 million state-of-the-art library named in his honour; further understands that the Sir Duncan Rice Library at the University of Aberdeen, which is internationally recognised as one of the most beautiful libraries in the world, was opened by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on 24 September 2012; understands that Professor Sir Charles Duncan Rice will be missed by many in the academic community, and sends sincere condolences to his family.

**\*[S6M-03101](#) Jackie Baillie: Scottish Water Charges** —That the Parliament believes that the new Scottish Water charges, which will begin in April 2022, will add pressure to the household finances of thousands of people across the country; understands that the increases, which it considers to be inflation-busting, were signed off by the Scottish Government and that charges for water have been set at the Consumer Price Index rate of inflation, plus 2%; further understands that Scottish Water has reserves of over £400 million, which, it considers, is taxpayers' money, and calls on the Scottish Government to reverse its reported decision to increase water bills by 4.2% and, instead, to freeze water prices at the 2021 level in order to help people across the country who, it believes, are set to be far worse off because of the reported cost of living crisis.
