S6M-03136 Michelle Thomson: International Women's Day 2022: Break the Bias—That the Parliament recognises 8 March 2022 as International Women's Day (IWD); acknowledges what it sees as the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women through history and around the world; understands that the theme of IWD 2022 is #BreakTheBias, which aims to highlight the impact of bias, both conscious and unconscious, on women and girls and to imagine a world free of bias, stereotype and discrimination; notes the view that it is important for MSPs to reaffirm a commitment to upholding the fundamental human rights of women and girls, while working together to accelerate gender parity in society; further notes the view that it is crucial for influential organisations to reject discrimination and abuse in society and within their own communities, while committing to be positive role models, and notes the calls to collaborate and unite behind the principles of IWD 2022, to ensure equity, diversity and inclusivity, and to break down barriers and forge women's equality in communities in Scotland and across the world.

Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

***[S6M-03196](#) Katy Clark: Fair and Fast Pension Compensation for 1950s Women—**That the Parliament regrets what it sees as the UK Government's inaction to end the injustice experienced by women affected by the changes to state pension laws; notes the campaign of the Women Against State Pension Injustice (WASPI) group, plus other similar campaign groups, to achieve fair and fast compensation arrangements for all women, including in the West Scotland region, who were born in the 1950s and were affected by these changes to state pension age, and further notes the calls for the Scottish Government to urge the UK Government to accept the reported findings of the Parliamentary and Health Service Ombudsman that 1950s-born women have been severely affected by Department for Work and Pensions maladministration, to take the swift action that many believe is needed to provide the recommended level of compensation to the women, and to compensate beneficiaries of the estates of those who are deceased and failed to receive a pension.

***[S6M-03445](#) Bill Kidd: Ash Wednesday Prayer and Fasting for Ukraine and Hillsong Ukraine Delivering Aid—**That the Parliament recognises the movement from the global church to call Christians to fast and pray on Ash Wednesday, 2 March 2022, as an act of spiritual support for the church and people of Ukraine, a country where the majority of the population is Christian; understands that Pope Francis has encouraged Christians to "dedicate themselves intensely to prayer and fasting [to] preserve the world from the madness of war", and that the Archbishop of Canterbury and the Archbishop of York of the Church of England are supporting Pope Francis's call for a global day of prayer and fasting for peace on Ash Wednesday, placing "trust in Jesus Christ, the author of peace" in whom Easter is celebrated; further understands that Ash Wednesday stands as a day for fasting, prayer and repentance, echoing the sackcloth and ashes worn by the Jewish people in the Old Testament, who prayed the Psalm "I will say of the Lord, He is my refuge and my fortress", as many Ukrainians will be praying today, and of Jesus's own 40 days of prayer and fasting in the wilderness; understands that Ukraine is the poorest country in Europe, and that many people do not have the financial resources to flee their homes; recognises the efforts of the church across Ukraine and, notably, Hillsong Church Kiev, where, it understands, the congregation are providing food and support to their fellow Ukrainians, including those who are fleeing and remaining in Kiev, and to orphans in Lviv, and further recognises the commitments of

Hillsong and other networks of churches in surrounding countries that are offering refuge and shelter to those who have crossed the border.

***[S6M-03427](#) Michelle Thomson: Nicola Benedetti Announced as Next Director of Edinburgh International Festival**—That the Parliament welcomes the announcement that Nicola Benedetti will be the next Director of the Edinburgh International Festival, succeeding Fergus Linehan, who has been Director since 2015; understands that Nicola will become the first woman and first Scot to direct the festival since its foundation in 1947; recognises what it sees as the importance of Edinburgh International Festival in bringing some of the world's brightest and most talented performers to Scotland's capital, which, it considers, has inspired people from across Scotland, including the Falkirk East constituency, to pursue a career in the arts; reflects upon the words of Nicola Benedetti in saying that music is the art of all the things we cannot see or touch, bringing millions together through the basic act of listening and the act of making melody, rhythm and harmony in the service of collective expression; considers that it is important that women are at the heart of leadership and progress in the music industry, ensuring that barriers are broken down in the promotion of culture across all communities; congratulates Nicola on her Directorship, and looks forward to seeing her influence bringing a new era to the Edinburgh International Festival.
