***[S6M-04263](#) Kate Forbes: Coronavirus (Recovery and Reform) (Scotland) Bill: Financial Resolution**—That the Parliament, for the purposes of any Act of the Scottish Parliament resulting from the Coronavirus (Recovery and Reform) (Scotland) Bill, agrees to—

(a) any expenditure of a kind referred to in Rule 9.12.3A of the Parliament's Standing Orders arising in consequence of the Act, and

(b) any charge or payment in relation to which Rule 9.12.4 of the Parliament's Standing Orders applies arising in consequence of the Act.

Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

***[S6M-04117](#) Alasdair Allan: Supporting Great Bernera's Community Land Buyout**—That the Parliament recognises the work of the Great Bernera Community Development Trust towards a crofting community buyout and the development of the island; understands that, despite concentrated efforts on the Trust's part to bring the crofting land's sale to completion, an apparent lack of cooperation by what it sees as the island's absentee landlord has reportedly delayed and halted necessary progress; is deeply concerned by reported recent demands for significant payments by the landlord from local crofters before he will give permission for various legitimate, and elsewhere payment-free, transactions to proceed; understands that, in recent years, the island's school and local shop have both closed; further understands that part 3 of the Land Reform (Scotland) Act 2003 has not yet been successfully utilised, but considers Bernera to be an example of where that approach may well be required; notes the hope that all relevant agencies can continue to support the Great Bernera Community Development Trust in securing the buyout of the crofting land, and further notes the calls on the landlord to engage constructively and promptly with the local community going forward.

***[S6M-04280](#) Christine Grahame: Celebrating Poland's National Constitution Day on 3 May**—That the Parliament extends its congratulations to the people of Poland, who celebrated their

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National Constitution Day on 3 May, the first declaration and adoption of their constitution having been on 3 May 1791; notes the long historic connections between Scotland and Poland and, in particular, the role of General Maczek who, in 1942, having had to quit the European battlefields of the Second World War where he had served with distinction, commanded the 1st Polish Armoured division, which served in defence of the Scottish coast between Montrose and the Firth of Forth, in his later years living in Leith; notes that the Great Polish Map of Scotland in Eddleston, in the Scottish Borders, which is believed to be the largest relief map in the world, commemorates what it sees as this great man, as does his statue at the City of Edinburgh Chambers, and extends its admiration to the people of Poland who, it believes, have extended unconditional sanctuary to Ukrainians fleeing the destruction of their proud country by Vladimir Putin and his army.

***[S6M-04245](#) Elena Whitham: Congratulations to Kaity Hall**—That the Parliament congratulates Kaity Hall from Mauchline, who it understands was nominated for the Badminton Europe Diversity Award in January 2022 and went on to win at the BEC Gala Awards in Malta on 9 April 2022; believes that Kaity has been rightly recognised for her incredible work over the last nearly 15 years, in enhancing the profile and accessibility of disability in badminton; understands that Kaity was formally a member of the late Mauchline Games Hall badminton club, and wishes her continued success in the future.

***[S6M-04243](#) Elena Whitham: Congratulations to Things Tae Dae Social Hub**—That the Parliament commends the hard work and dedication of the Things Tae Dae social hub in Cumnock on celebrating its 10th anniversary by holding a prom, which it understands was cancelled in December 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic; understands that the staff all had an amazing time celebrating this fantastic achievement; further understands that Things Tae Dae are an all-ability group in Cumnock that runs twice weekly by arranging days out, litter-picking days, fundraising events and other amazing activities within the local community, and wishes them every success for the future.

***[S6M-04242](#) Katy Clark: Food Bank Use**—That the Parliament notes with concern reports from the Trussell Trust that need at foodbanks in Scotland is 31% higher today than it was at the same period five years ago; understands that food banks in the Trussell Trust's network provided almost 200,000 emergency food parcels to people facing financial hardship between 1 April 2021 and 31 March 2022; notes from the reports that more than 70,000 emergency food parcels were provided to children; believes that the number of families forced to use a food bank will likely increase due

to inflation and rising bills; notes the view that the UK Government has not acted to protect incomes by raising benefits in line with inflation; believes that food poverty is a scourge upon the country and that foodbanks should not need to exist in 21st century Scotland; notes that a consultation on the proposed Right to Food (Scotland) Bill, which is a member's bill proposal that seeks to incorporate the right to food into Scots Law, has recently closed, and calls on the Scottish Government to take steps to ensure that nobody in Scotland struggles to afford essential food items by doubling the Scottish Child Payment to £40 a week, increasing Scottish Child Bridging Payments, providing lump sum payments for people eligible for council tax reduction and increasing funding for the Scottish Welfare Fund.

***S6M-04239 Alasdair Allan: Recognising NHS Western Isles' Daily COVID-19 Updates**—That the Parliament notes the recent announcement by NHS Western Isles that it will stop publishing daily COVID-19 numbers; commends NHS Western Isles staff, and its Chief Executive Gordon Jamieson, for the efforts they have gone to in keeping the public informed throughout the COVID-19 pandemic; understands that Gordon has been providing video updates on social media almost every evening since the beginning of pandemic, giving out details on case numbers, testing and vaccination clinics; considers that these updates acted as a source of reassurance to the public during an unprecedented public health emergency, while ensuring important information was widely distributed, and recognises what it sees as the enormous contribution that both health and care staff have made in providing care in very difficult circumstances, at the same time as a vaccination programme provided at a pace that rivalled, it believes, any other community in the country.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
