***[S6M-06249](#) Jamie Halcro Johnston: Women's Rugby World Cup**—That the Parliament notes the start of the women's Rugby World Cup, which will run from 8 October to 12 November 2022, in New Zealand; understands that the Scotland team is one of twelve teams to successfully qualify for the tournament; recognises the successful growth in the women's game in recent years and its positive effect on the sport more generally, and wishes Scotland, the other home nations and all the teams competing the very best wishes for the event.

***[S6M-06245](#) Christine Grahame: Asda "Winter Warmer" Support for Pensioners and Community Groups**—That the Parliament welcomes Asda's recent announcement of a range of new "winter warmer" initiatives to support customers and community groups struggling with the cost of living crisis; understands that these include an offer to everyone aged 60 and over to purchase soup, a roll and unlimited tea and coffees for £1 in any in-store Asda cafes, every day throughout November and December, which will run alongside the current "Kids Eat for £1" offer; notes that this will be accompanied by the "Community Cuppa" campaign in Asda cafes, which creates space for local groups, who may otherwise struggle to meet due to rising energy costs, to come together on weekdays in November and December from 2.00 to 6.00 pm, with all community group members receiving unlimited free tea or coffee whilst present; recognises that the Asda Foundation is also providing funding worth £500,000 to support community groups that are struggling with rising operating costs or increased demand for their services, with individual grants worth up to a maximum of £2,000 available and priority given to groups and charities that need financial help to cover increased energy costs or who want to use their facilities to create warm spaces for those who cannot afford to heat their homes, alongside all Asda Community Champions being given an increased monthly budget during October, November and December to increase the practical support they can offer to local good causes; believes that, whilst it is deeply troubling such measures are necessary, these initiatives will be a help to those struggling, and commends those businesses seeking to support their local communities.

***[S6M-06244](#) Liam McArthur: 70th Anniversary of Stromness Eventide Club**—That the Parliament congratulates the Stromness and Parish Eventide Club on its 70th anniversary, which was celebrated on 18 September 2022; notes that the Eventide Club at the Stromness Pier Head provides a regular and welcoming space for over 65s to meet, socialise and take part in a host of games and activities, enjoyed over afternoon tea provided by a team of dedicated volunteers; understands that the milestone was celebrated by a meal in the Ferry Inn accompanied by a general knowledge quiz and the surprise arrival of two cakes kindly donated by Argo's Bakery and Ronnie Mowat, both ably cut by regular eventide-goer, Caroline Fotheringhame; recognises the immense contribution the Eventide Club has provided in tackling loneliness and fostering a sense of community for over 65s in Stromness; commends the generous donation of Cooke Aquaculture to the Eventide Club, which will help support future events, ongoing activities and energy bills; pays tribute to the long-standing support of the Stromness Community Council and the wider community to this invaluable institution; thanks Chairwoman Wendy Flett, Vice-chairwoman Kay Macnair and all those involved at the Eventide Club, and wishes it all the very best for the future.

***[S6M-06243](#) Liam McArthur: Orkney Research and Development Campus Opening**—That the Parliament welcomes the official opening of the Orkney Research and Development Campus (ORIC) in Stromness, on 23 September 2022, by Fred Olsen; understands that the multi-million-pound joint venture between Highlands and Islands Enterprise (HIE) and Orkney Islands Council (OIC) has created a new and improved home for Orkney's world-leading marine renewables, energy and low-carbon sector; notes that the 3.75-acre campus, based in the refurbished former Stromness Academy and Primary School, has received significant investment from both the Scottish and UK governments through the Islands Growth Deal; celebrates the announcement from HIE and OIC that a £2.8 million package of funding has been approved to develop the second phase of development at ORIC, which is expected to create an additional 165 jobs over the next decade, building on the 160 already based at the campus; considers that ORIC provides a fantastic facility to foster co-working and collaboration between academic and commercial activity in Orkney who are driven towards achieving Scotland's net zero ambitions; further considers that ORIC will help strengthen Orkney's global lead in the field of renewables research and innovation and support the growth and creation of local businesses, which, it believes, will help to attract and retain young people looking to live, work and study in Orkney; pays tribute to the long-standing support of Mr Olsen and Fred Olsen-related companies towards Orkney's renewable energy sector; applauds their recent donation to Orkney's 17 primary schools of illustrated books, *Gaia's Energy Adventure!*, which was commissioned by the Supergen Offshore Renewable Energy Hub and, it understands, communicates the benefits of renewable energy and encourages girls to consider a career in engineering; commends the support to ORIC by OIC, HIE, Heriot-Watt University, Robert Gordon University, European Marine Energy Centre, Aquatera and many more local organisations, and wishes all those involved at the campus a very successful future.

***S6M-06188 Graeme Dey: Veterans and Serving Armed Forces Personnel Claiming Universal Credit**—That the Parliament notes what it sees as the recent revelation, announced by UK Government Minister of State at the Department for Work and Pensions, that almost 3,000 members of the Armed Forces have been forced into claiming Universal Credit as the cost of living soars; expresses its shock that such numbers of serving personnel cannot rely on their salary to cover their living costs; understands that UK Armed Forces personnel have been subject to years of Conservative administration-imposed pay restraint and laments what it considers is the evident insufficiency of UK Government support for those who are prepared to make the ultimate sacrifice for their country; acknowledges the figures indicating a 12% rise in Universal Credit claims over the last four months, to 38,000, by veterans who it believes are clearly being failed in spite of the promised Armed Forces Covenant; notes the reported near-£3 billion investment by the Scottish Government in 2022-23 in a wide range of targeted support unique to Scotland, on top of the lower 19% rate of income tax for the lowest paid; urges the UK Government to match these measures UK-wide, and considers that those presently serving in the Armed Forces should receive a salary that ensures they can afford to live without having to turn to Universal Credit.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
