Pre-budget scrutiny for 2025 to 2026: evidence from stakeholders

Introduction

- 1. This paper supports the Committee's evidence gathering for its pre-budget scrutiny for 2025 to 2026.
- 2. In line with the Budget Process Review Group (BPRG) report, Scottish Parliament committees undertake pre-budget scrutiny in advance of the publication of the Scottish Government's budget.
- 3. The purpose of pre-budget scrutiny is for committees to provide comment to the Scottish Government, in the form of a letter or report, at least six weeks prior to the Scottish Government's budget for the purpose of influencing the budget when spending priorities are set.
- 4. Further information on the budget process has been published by SPICe.

Background

- 5. At its meeting on 19 June 2024, the Committee agreed to take the following dual approach to pre-budget scrutiny:
 - Scrutiny of the overall budget of the rural and islands portfolio.
 - Giving specific attention to the Marine Directorate's budget, focusing on fisheries management operations and science.
- 6. To support the Committee's scrutiny of the overall rural affairs and islands portfolio, it agreed to issue a short consultation over summer recess asking for views on the Scottish Government's spending priorities.
- 7. The Committee received 14 responses to its consultation. <u>The responses can be read on the Parliament's webpages</u>.
- 8. The Cabinet Secretary for Rural Affairs, Land Reform and Islands wrote to the Committee on 22 July 2024, providing information about the Marine Directorate's budget.
- 9. The Committee undertook a fact-finding visit to the Marine Directorate science laboratories in Aberdeen on 2 September 2024.

Evidence sessions

10. The Committee agreed to hold a roundtable evidence session with stakeholders regarding the budget of the Marine Directorate on 4 September 2024.

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11. The Committee will then hear from the Cabinet Secretary for Rural Affairs, Land Reform and Islands on 11 September 2024.
