Petroineos Grangemouth Note by the Clerk

Background

- 1. The refinery at Grangemouth has been in operation since the 1920s. It is currently owned by <u>Petroineos</u>, a refining and energy trading joint venture between <u>PetroChina</u> and the <u>INEOS Group</u>.
- 2. On 22 November 2023, it was announced that the refinery would transition into a finished fuels import terminal and distribution hub. On 12 September 2024, it was confirmed that this transition would take place during the second guarter of 2025.
- 3. The Cabinet Secretary for Net Zero and Energy <u>wrote to the Committee</u> following this confirmation, outlining actions being undertaken by the Scottish Government.
- 4. The Minister for Climate Action <u>wrote to the Committee on 7 November 2024</u> to highlight the launch of a consultation on the draft Grangemouth Just Transition Plan. This letter can be found at **Annexe A**.

Previous Committee Scrutiny

- 5. Last year the Committee held an inquiry into a just transition for the Grangemouth area.
- 6. While INEOS did not formally engage with the inquiry, it fed into a <u>written</u> <u>submission</u> from Forth Ports Limited and the Forth Green Freeport, as well as <u>oral evidence</u> provided by Forth Ports Limited. The company also hosted a visit by the Committee on 20 March 2023.
- 7. The Committee <u>published its report on 21 June 2023</u>.
- Following the November 2023 announcement, the Committee took evidence on <u>Wednesday 13 December 2023</u> from Petroineos Manufacturing Scotland Ltd, INEOS Grangemouth, and the then Cabinet Secretary for Wellbeing Economy, Fair Work and Energy. The Committee also heard from the then Minister for Energy Security and Net Zero on <u>Wednesday 17 January 2024</u>.

The plan will now enter into a ten week public consultation period, ending on 16 January 2025. During this time, it is our intention to collect views on the plan's content from community, industry, the industrial workforce, and all others with a vested interested in the future of the Grangemouth industrial cluster.

Firstly, I would like to thank you for your ongoing insights that have helped the development of this work to date, largely through the Committee's inquiry into a Just Transition for Grangemouth. Specifically, your input has played a significant role in raising the profile of Grangemouth as a region that will be critical in meeting our climate ambitions feedback, as well as highlighting key areas for attention.

As you will be aware, we are developing this work in partnership with the Grangemouth Future Industry Board, which has approved this draft for publication.
